GENERAL INFORMATION AND ATTACHMENTS

Sadly, I am having to bring an incident that happened yesterday (21st June 2025) to your attention. During pick-up time after school, 2 out of 3 of our metal 'school children' were 'plowed' down whilst on the yellow zig-zag lines leaving tyre marks across both signs. Luckily Mr Warrener has been able to fix them.

Whilst we understand that accidents do happen and although we are unclear as to the exact details, the incident has shaken us as we reflect on 'what if this had been a real child?'. We are disappointed that this initiative has still not prevented people driving down School Lane with caution particularly near the school entrance.

We appreciate how busy school drop off and pick up can be, but ask respectfully that if you really must (for whatever reason that you are unable to use all the other parking facilities available to you) drive down to the school, that you approach with the utmost caution and

care as you never know when a child (pupil or smaller sibling) may dash out or fall over into the road.

You will have noticed in the Dates for your Diary that we have a Bags2School collection on the 12th June, your child/ren will be bringing home a bag today, so if you are going to have a half-term clear out, please bear this in mind – good quality Adult or Children clothing, shoes, hats, belts and handbags. Sadly, they are no longer able to collect soft toys, towels, bedding and curtains. I will remind you closer to the date, but please do not leave the bags outside in case of inclement weather, the bags will not be collected if wet.

The proofs from the Class photographs taken on Friday 16th June, should have come home with your children yesterday. Please order by 4th June in order to take advantage of free delivery to the school. We have used a new company that have been recommended to us from other local primary schools.

I have had several enquiries regarding Sports Day (this was on the Dates for the Diary sent at the beginning of term 5). To confirm the date, Sports Day will be on the Wednesday 25th June – weather permitting and you are welcome to join us from 12pm onwards.
